Dear Parent/Guardian,

We wish to thank our parent community for their ongoing financial support of our school and its programs through Family Payments and Contributions. Our community has gathered together for a number of fun and engaging activities this year which has continued to strengthen our school community and raise valuable funds which we are able to spend on your children. With your help we have continued to make adjustments to our curriculum delivery whilst also maintaining our high standards of social, emotional and academic care.

In recognition of the increased cost of living expenses and with significant changes to government funding for schools we have tried to keep our costs for the Essential Curriculum Contributions stable. However, with recent funding cuts and a rise in our expenses we have been forced to make a small increase in contributions for 2025.

We have recently completed an audit of items already onsite, and we have taken current stock levels into account when purchasing for next year. Student personal resources will continue to be used for the remainder of this year and will be taken home in the last week of school.

Recent financial contributions have resulted in significant investments in STEAM equipment, laptop computers in our Middle School, and ICT infrastructure upgrades to assist our staff to provide high quality programs for your children. These funds also assist with the care and maintenance of our beautiful and extensive grounds which the students are fortunate to enjoy.

Moving forward into 2025 we will continue to invest heavily into Literacy, Numeracy and ICT as well as placing a strong commitment to upgrading our health and wellbeing support programs throughout the school. Your contributions will assist us to implement a number of key programs with a focus on mental health and wellbeing.

We greatly appreciate all parents' full support to generate the funds required to deliver these programs with the necessary resources. We would like to emphasize that this money is used during the school year for the direct and immediate benefit of each individual student. We make every effort to keep the cost of items and activities to a minimum and affordable to all families.

2025 contributions are divided into 4 areas

1. Student Stationery Packs

This year stationery packs will be purchased online through our school supplier KaKaKids. You simply log in, www.shopmpps.com.au select PURCHASE BOOKLISTS and enter the code mpps4935 to access your book lists and follow the prompts to complete your order. You can choose to either order and pay online and have the books delivered to the classroom for the start of term 2025 or, you could source your own as per attached list on the booklist website. If you do purchase your own, please include all items on the list.

2. Essential Curriculum Contributions - items and activities that students use, or participate in, to access the Curriculum. These funds, which are outlined clearly in the attached letter, support your child to participate in all learning areas.

3. Other Contributions - for non-curriculum items and activities

We continue to welcome your voluntary contributions to support our school.

- a. General Voluntary Contributions go towards all of our school's priorities for 2025 as well as providing additional activities and services for all students. In 2025 this will be used to facilitate number of mental health and wellbeing initiatives.
- b. The Building and Library Funds, which are tax deductible, are managed under Government guidelines and are used exclusively to provide resources for our students. All donations to these funds are fully tax deductible. These will be used to enhance the resources of the library, including ICT resources that will be housed in the library area, and maintenance and upgrades to our buildings. Our recent library refurbishment was funded in part by these contributions.
- c. Voluntary contributions to ICT assist the upgrade of our ICT resources and infrastructure. Grounds contributions allow us to maintain the grounds and playgrounds and employ a grounds maintenance person to assist with regular upkeep.

Your child will not be disadvantaged if you do not make a voluntary contribution. All records of voluntary contributions are kept confidential as well as your decision about whether to make a contribution or not.

4. Excursions, incursions, camps, swimming, and sport activities

Excursions, incursions, camps, swimming, and sport activities which are a vital component of your child's learning experience, will be charged individually throughout the year closer to the event.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary.

Our school understands that families may experience financial difficulties and values a proactive approach to supporting families. Alternative payment arrangements are available through the school. One Page Overview



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).

FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
